SUMMER SCHOOL -FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What does the course cost?

Our two-week journalism summer school costs £645 and the course fee must be paid in advance. Limited places are available on the course, so a non-refundable £195 deposit is required to confirm your attendance.

Where does the course run?

The course currently runs in our London office only.

What are the registration requirements?

There are no specific entry requirements but a good standard of written English is essential if you are going to take full advantages of the study programme. You will be required to complete an entry document and all decisions as to suitability are made at our discretion.

Is there any recommended reading? We will provide a full range of course and study notes for you as part of your course fee.

Will this study programme be enough to get me a journalism job?

Our journalism summer school is aimed at providing essential foundation skills. Throughout the course we will give you a broad understanding of the demands of the industry.

Many of those who study at the summer school move on to further National Council for the Training of Journalists training with News Associates.

News Associates runs this training in London and Manchester, with full- and part-time study options, lasting between 22 and 40 weeks.

We train more NCTJ-accredited journalists in the UK every year than anyone else.


And in the past three years our trainees have dominated the NCTJ Awards for Excellence, which are open to journalism schools across the country.

HOW TO FIND US



AMPERSAND HOUSE, 49-53 YORK STREET, LONDON TW1 3LP

Ampersand House is a five-minute walk from Twickenham train station. Come out of the station and walk left over the bridge down London Road then take a left turn down Arragon Road and follow the road round. Turn left onto Richmond Road and the office is on the left-hand side.

If you are coming from Richmond train or tube (District line) station then the 33 bus (Elton Street, stop L) takes just six minutes (eight stops), get off at York Street Twickenham (Stop G) and walk one minute back up Richmond Road (keep Pizza Express and Zizzi on your left) and the office will be on your left.
